Virtual Pilgrimages

Thousands experienced Lourdes this year in a series of *6 Virtual Pilgrimages*, multiple events at military communities, parishes, schools, univsersities, women's groups and youth orgranizations. Virtual Pilgrimage provides a "spiritual journey" in an interactive 90 minute guided experience with Lourdes Water, Grotto Rock, Eucharistic Blessing & the Rosary.

Feast Day Pilgrimage

A February 11 American pilgrimage was offered to the Lourdes Grotto in Alabama to honor Our Lady, her Feast and the World Day of the Sick.

Lourdes Pilgrimages

- *9 Volunteer Service Pilgrimages* facilitated 144 individuals to serve the Hospitalité Notre-Dame de Lourdes.
- 2 Youth Catechesis Pilgrimages directed 60 teens with chaperones to serve special needs pilgrims at Lourdes.
- 4 Special Needs Pilgrimages assisted 243 pilgrims including ill, handicapped, family members, medical volunteers and caregivers including Deaf & Hard of Hearing and Military Wounded, Veterans Retired and Active Duty service members along with two annual special needs pilgrimages, in June and October.

Talks and Retreats

The Message of Lourdes was available to over 150 million viewers worldwide during our television appearanace on EWTNLive! in addition to radio and conference talks including the Military Councel of Catholic Women of Europe in Germany.

NORTH AMERICAN LOURDES VOLUNTEERS HOSPITALITY

CATHOLIC CHURCH

Established by Most Reverend James M. Moynihan June 10, 2005, under Title V Canon 312 §3 as a Public Association of the Christian Faithful; North American Lourdes Volunteers devotes itself to the initiatives of evangelization and charity.

ECCLESIAL AUTHORITY

This Association is under the Ecclesial Authority of the Most Reverend Robert Cunningham, Bishop of the (New York) Syracuse Diocese.

Chaplains are appointed by the Bishop to guide the association. Order of Friars Minor, Father Jeffrey Keefe, provides spiritual direction to guide and assist the Association and is also the Liaison to the Office of the Bishop.

GOVERNANCE

The Association is governed according to the statutes approved by the Ecclesial Authority and the Board of Directors. The Statutes are in compliance with both state and federal regulations for charities.

ADMINISTRATION

The Association is guided by a Board of Directors who are not compensated or paid for their leadership services. The Association operations are coordinated by (unpaid) Founding Administrator, Mrs. Marlene Watkins, as appointed by the Bishop. Association activities and finances, including the annual audit, are reported each year to the Bishop.

NEW YORK STATE

The Association was incorporated in New York in 2003 and operates within the state norms and laws for legal entities, abiding by state charity requirements and conducts bi-annual meetings.

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

Tax-exempt status as a 501(c)3 was granted in 2003 affording the Association the privileges and obligations of a charity. An annual audit and 990 financial report are completed as required by the IRS. As a 501(c)3 non-profit, all donations and contributions are tax deductible within the legal allowable guidelines.

HOSPITALITIES

The Hospitalité Notre-Dame de Lourdes is under the authority of the Bishop of Tarbes et Lourdes and is comprised of individuals from various countries who come to Lourdes in volunteer service to welcome pilgrims. Diocesan, national and religious hospitalities accompany sick pilgrims to Lourdes under their ordinary with the blessing of the Bishop of Tarbes et Lourdes.

LOURDES VOLUNTEERS

Our Lady of Lourdes Hospitality North American Volunteers, the first hospitality of the Americas, became an aggregated member of the Hospitalité Notre-Dame de Lourdes on December 17, 2006.

AVE MARIA TRAVEL

A wholly-owned not-for-profit subsidiary of Lourdes Volunteers, Ave Maria Travel is the negotiating agency for all airline contracts, all travel arrangements and travel/medical insurance. All audited financial information is included within Lourdes Volunteers statements.

FULFILLING OUR MISSION

144 volunteers each served Hospitalité for one week in 2009. Volunteers ranged in age from 17 years old to 75 years young, arriving from dioceses as far away as Slovakia, Columbia, Trinidad and Tobago, Venezuela and the largest archdiocese in the world, our US Military Archdiocese.

77 women offered one week of service assisting in the baths, the Service of St. Jean de Baptiste, 30 men

in the Service of St. Joseph lifted pilgrims on stretchers at the train station and at the airport, assisted in the baths and daily processions, while 36 women served in housekeeping and dining rooms at both Accueils, with one volunteer teaching in Formation.

60 youth came as pilgrimage volunteers offering humble service in the unglamorous duties necessary to make pilgrimage possible for those unable to travel without assistance. Learning, Living and Loving the Message of Lourdes made a life changing experience for chaperones, teens and those they served.

243 pilgrims aged 1 to 90 traveled from 28 states and home countries as far as Uganda, Argentina, France and Canada including 11 religious, 3 babies, 22 medical professionals and 110 caregivers and companions. 48 special needs pilgrims included wheelchair-bound and profoundly handicapped individuals, several seriously or terminally ill and many unaccompanied pilgrims traveled to Lourdes

with personal and medical supportive care provided.

Volunteers gave their service paying their own costs for pilgrimage.

Each pilgrimage was directed by an experienced leader

and member of the Hospitalité. Priests accompanied pilgrimages offering Mass and spiritual direction throughout the week.



Liability Insurance is the umbrella policy purchased by the Association protecting against injury, misconduct, neglect, abuse, damage or accident.


PILGRIMAGE MONIES

Serving Hospitalité Notre-Dame de Lourdes or American Pilgrimage



There are two distinct services at Lourdes: to welcome pilgrims by assisting at the Sanctuaries with the Hospitalité Notre-Dame de Lourdes or to accompany pilgrims to the Sanctuaries at Lourdes throughout their pilgrimage journey.

Service to the Sanctuaries requires schooling and training to serve as a member of an international team of volunteers for one week. Without the 8,000 charitable lay volunteers who commit to return annually at their own expense to serve at Lourdes, the Sanctuaries would be unable to continue to receive over six million pilgrims each year.

Equally, without dedicated volunteer helpers willing to be trained for supportive care and one-on-one assistance throughout travel and stay with North American Lourdes Volunteers, most pilgrims would be unable to make the long arduous journey to France and home.

FACILITATING OUR MISSION

"With God ALL things are possible" is the motto of the dedicated office team who responds to inquiries, arrange travel and process pilgrimage registration. Also, the team coordinates virtual pilgrimages as well as the design and printing of all Association brochures, materials and publications.

Two full-time employees manage the pilgrimage and travel operations while one part-time employee coordinates our Special Needs Pilgrimages with our Head Nurse volunteer. One full-time employee manages bookkeeping and accounting. Three part-time technology volunteers and one full-time volunteer administrator offer their time and service as unpaid office directors and helpers.

Each staff person can join one of our pilgrimages as an employee benefit and as job training to offer first-hand experience to assist others to Lourdes.

Flexible hours and healthcare benefits help to offset non-profit wages offering employees a fair compensation package for hard but spiritually rewarding work.

The team of paid and volunteer staff is committed to Our Lady of Lourdes and sharing her message in the service of her pilgrims and volunteers.

Managing pilgrimages requires a team of dedicated volunteers to lead the group and coordinate the activities. Chaplains and Group Leaders are not required to pay pilgrimage costs, however, some donate their time, talent and services and also the cost of their pilgrimage as a contribution.
